IPM is a flexible and dynamic process

“Careful consideration of all available plant protection methods and subsequent **integration of appropriate measures that discourage** the development of populations of harmful organisms and **keep the use of plant protection products** and other forms of intervention to levels that are economically and ecologically justified and reduce **or minimise risks** to human health and the environment” (EC 128/2009)



An overview

21 countries and 32 partners committed to:

- ❖ Identify synergies and gaps in their existing national programs on IPM;
- ❖ Align IPM research throughout Member States (including solutions for minor uses).
- ❖ Organize and fund joint transnational calls;
- ❖ Ensure a better implementation of IPM in Europe.



Build a Strategic Research Agenda for IPM in Europe

- Map and analyze existing national programmes, which facilitate research and extension strategies on IPM;
- Assess to what extent these existing national IPM programmes could be better coordinated;
- **Identify future research needs;**
- Identify those R & D activities that need to be developed and/or coordinated.

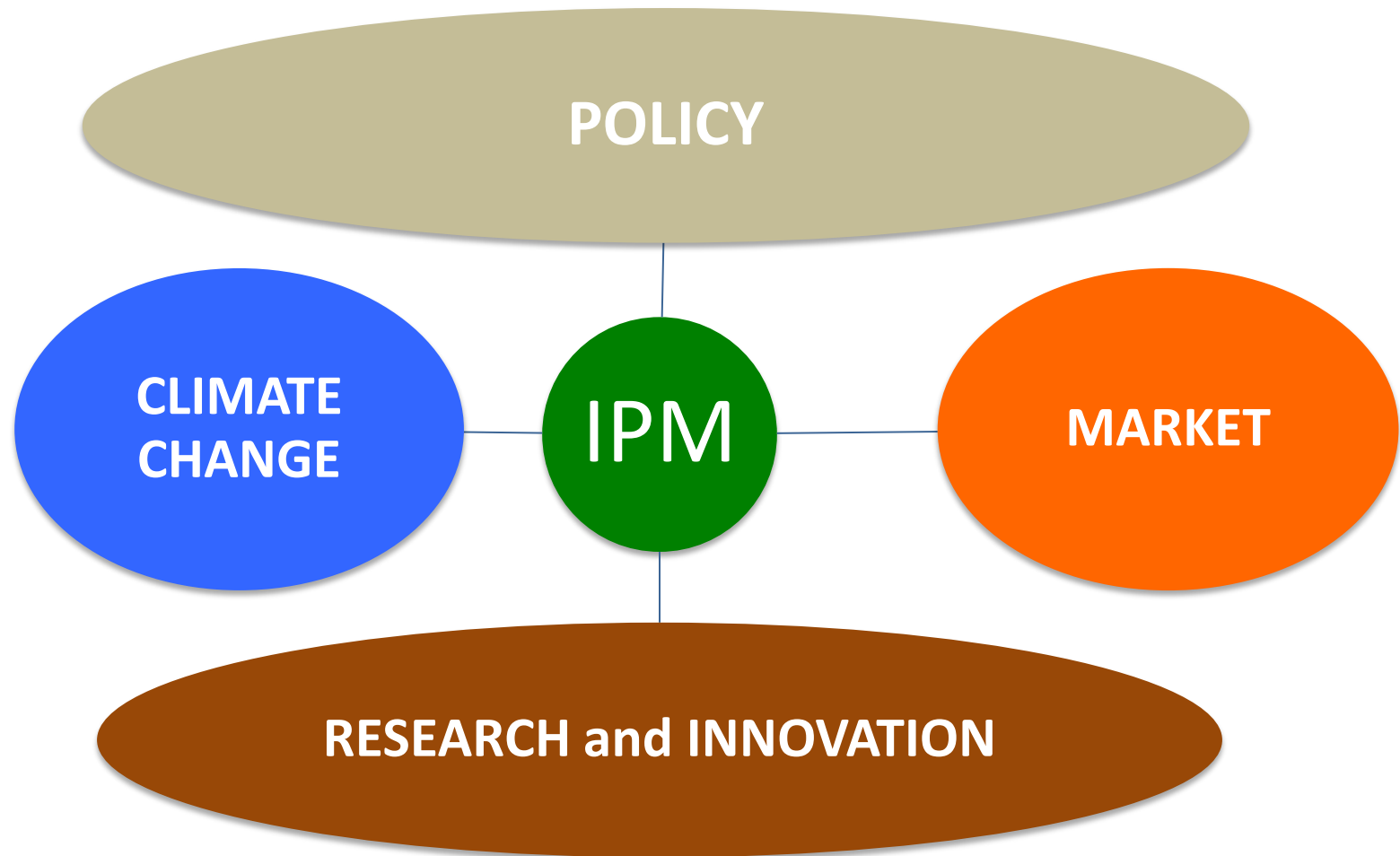

Future challenges for IPM in a changing agriculture

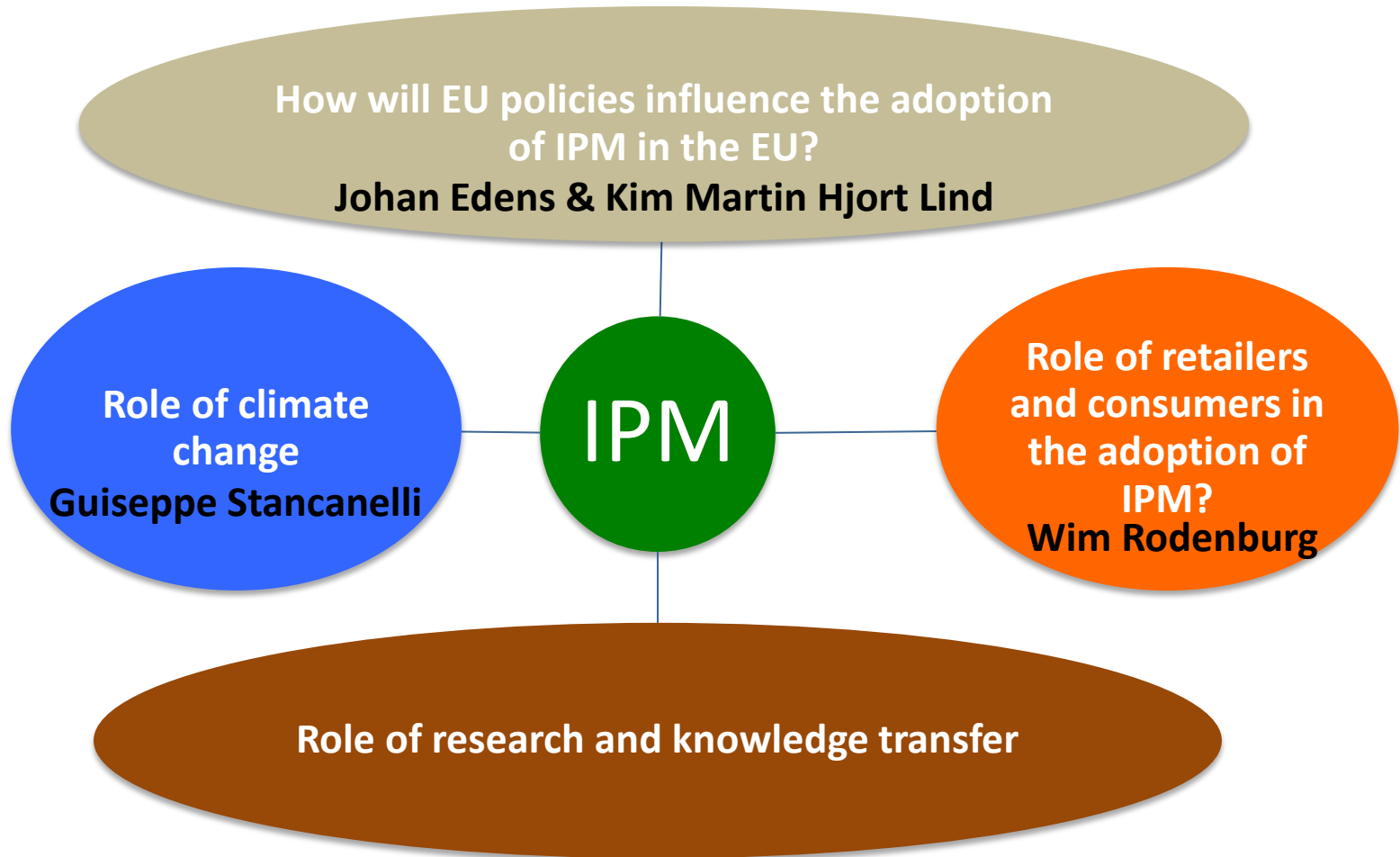
Develop a common vision of how IPM could frame the future of European agriculture and research in order to:
